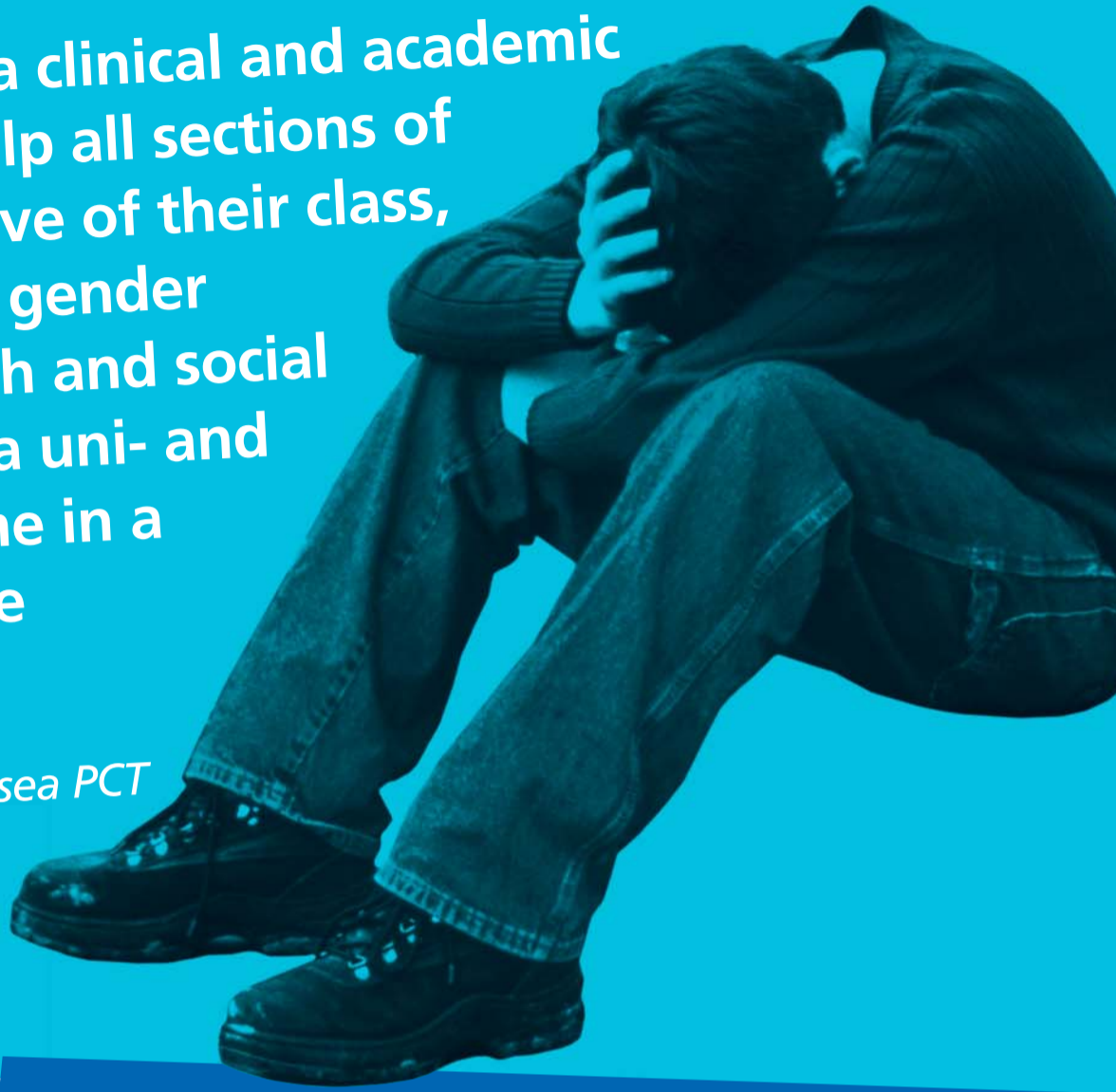


# clinical psychology
