Dr Daniel Jolley is a Senior Lecturer at Northumbria University. Daniel's main area of research is the psychology of conspiracy theories. In his research, he uses experimental methods to examine the social consequences of conspiracy theories. He has also tested tools to address the negative impacts of conspiracy theories. Daniel has co-authored articles in outlets such as *PLoS ONE*, the *British Journal of Psychology*, the *British Journal of Social Psychology* and *Political Psychology* and has received funding from research bodies such as the British Academy.

Daniel has been a Committee Member for several years. He first joined as the Postgraduate Representative (2012 – 2014), followed by being elected as the Website Officer (2014 – 2016) and then Honorary Secretary (2016 – 2019). He was elected to a second-term as Honorary Secretary in 2019 for a further three years. Daniel has also been acting as Honorary Treasurer since 2017.
