Submission 1 Formative

One report demonstrating coverage of up to two core areas

Submission 2 Formative

Two – four reports demonstrating coverage of core areas not covered in Submission 1

Final Submission

Three reports covering a minimum of three core areas + VIVA

Are you a potential student?

Why the QOP (Stage 2) is right for you:

- Become an Occupational Psychologist practitioner using work-based practice
- The Qualification in Occupational Psychology offers a flexible approach to manage the qualification around your work over two, three or four years
- You'll earn a doctoral level qualification which makes you eligible for Chartered membership of the BPS and full membership of the Division of Occupational Psychology
- You will be eligible to register with the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC)
- Fees can be paid over a period of up to 48 months

To be eligible, candidates must:

- Hold current Graduate basis for Chartered Membership (GBC) of the Society
- Have completed a Society-accredited Master's degree in Occupational Psychology
- Be in a position to undertake supervised practice in the field of Occupational Psychology

Fees and payment:

- Fees are £5,708 (including VAT)
- Your fees can be paid by monthly direct debit, please ask for details.
